

SALON JURY'S WORD

Janet Rogerson I was truly honoured to be invited as a judge for the VIGEX International Salon.

From what I witnessed on the day I judged, the committee and all the helpers need to be complimented for the splendid job they did in providing the smooth running of the event.

The art of print making even in this digital age is an involved and precise skill that not everyone can master. An actual tactile print for me, will always be the final process needed to be achieved in the procedure of photography. Therefore it was a joy for me to be judging prints.

Portrait/People section. All entrants need to be commended on participating in the VIGEX International. Particularly enjoyable were the images that told a story or were poignant in their pictorial content. I did not mind whether this was achieved candidly or whether it was via a contrived image. Of utmost importance at this level of competition was the technical component, achieved both in camera and at the time of processing. Unfortunately I found many images to be lacking in this area. With portrait images, the eyes need to be sharp. Too many images suffered from the focal point focusing on the wrong part of the image. I also found quite a few images where skin was over softened in post processing. In contrast to this, some faces were over sharpened and quite a few images were "over processed" or poorly manipulated. When any of the aforementioned techniques are obvious

to the observer's eye, then the maker has been too heavy handed with the approach. I found it disappointing that many of the prints in this section fell short of International standard. Some however were lovely and the printed output on correctly chosen paper to impart a certain "feel" to an image, was a highlight.

I would like to offer congratulations to all who gained acceptances and awards in this highly acclaimed International Salon.

Tina Dial It was with pleasure I accepted the invitation to judge at VIGEX this year, in the Open and Nature sections. I love viewing the work from many parts of the world, and in the print medium. There was a variety of paper types used and interesting to see how well the 'art' paper images looked compared to the standard gloss print. Unfortunately the sharpness let down many good images, it is important to make sure your files will print correctly, especially in the larger sizes. Colour casts were also another small problem.

It was also heartening to see only a very few images not conforming to the nature definition compared to other competitions I have judged. It is always so important to read the rules for every competition.

Congratulations to the award winners, your images are wonderful. It was a very tough decision with so many good images to choose from.

Thankyou to the VIGEX team for a professionally and smoothly run salon, it was a delight to judge.

John Chapman It was a pleasure to judge three sections this year and the VIGEX Committee and its huge team of hard working volunteers are to be commended for running another successful exhibition. The judging ran smoothly and a feature of the system used at VIGEX is that it allows each judge to spend as much time as they need on each print. All the awards were of a very high standard and the judges had a hard time deciding the award and merit winners. Some excellent prints missed out on awards. Many entrants presented ink-jet based prints and sometimes these lack a solid black and can be disadvantaged when compared to silver based processes. A common problem in all sections was over-sharpening and a suggestion for future entrants is to sharpen to where it starts to become visible then cut the amount by about a third to where the image is improved but sharpening is not visible. Some entrants presented four very similar images and it's common for judges to mark later prints lower as it is desirable to produce an exhibition that displays a wide variety of subjects rather than multiple near identical images. Many entries in Monochrome were digital prints. A number were over-sharpened and a few displayed colour shifts with green or magenta fringing being visible. These may have benefited from an extra de-saturation being applied after final sharpening. Nature presented many fine prints but some were given low marks as they did not meet the nature definition. Roads in landscapes, farm animals and rolling farm fields were given low scores. Story telling is the key to good Photo Journalism and those that engage the viewer also engaged the judges! While some prints did have problems, overall many fine images missed out on being selected and those who gained acceptances and awards should be pleased with their success.

Peter Dwyer It was my pleasure and honour to be asked to judge at the 2015 VIGEX International for the sections of Monochrome and Photojournalism. In both sections the top dozen or so works were of exceptional quality and this augurs well for the continuing support of a print-only exhibition.

Finalizing the top entries presented a number of challenges for interpretation of the rules of entry. In the case of monochrome there were a significant number of images that either did not or barely met the criteria of representing tones of only one colour. In some cases this was clearly a matter of poor print work but in others the colour cast was subtle and confined to enhance the principal subject. The concept of photojournalism was challenged in many cases in what appeared to be patently constructed and posed scenarios highly worked with photo editing software. Also evident were entries by different makers so similar as to raise the suspicion that they were the products of a studio or workshop group. This is not to deny the exceptional artistry in many of these works.

In any competition there will be entries that will test the definitions at the margin and it will be the call of the three judges to decide their fate. In spite of these challenges I believe that the awarded and accepted images made by the panel are of excellent quality and within the spirit of the rules.

Gail Pollard It was a pleasure to be asked to assist with the judging of the nature section this year. The array of prints offered an impressive challenge due to the diverse range of subject matter from many entrants from around the world and the number of prints put forward. It was pleasing to see the subjects ranging broadly from close up to wide angle, from insects to icebergs, action shots contrasting with still images and birds to bugs. It was pleasing to see a range of subjects receiving awards with the award winners being outstanding in their field

John Conway Always an exciting prospect when there is the element of photography and people's imagination, and the entries at VIGEX didn't disappoint. It was also good to see some new ideas being tried out in the section, and for me the ingenuity was rewarded and these are what all photographers should be aspiring to do, experiment and not just replicate what others are doing. Creating montages with multiple images and placed in what would seem as random areas still prevails although there was less evidence at the salon. There were quite a few well thought out "scenes" with a story to tell, which is important and although the viewer may not know the story they can make something out of it as it captures the imagination.

Another pleasing aspect was that many of the entries were of a high quality of print. Sometimes digital projected images can gloss over minor flaws whereas the print reveals all, so it was good to see the high standard of print work.

Congratulations to all those that received awards and acceptances in a very strong competition

Adrian Donoghue It was my pleasure to judge both the open colour and creative print sections. The open section displayed a range of styles ranging from large scale cinematic captures to simpler studio based portraiture. Cultural differences in styles definitely made it more interesting from a judging perspective. The majority of the work was of a high standard, however a number of prints were let down by a lack of sharpness. Participants in print only Salons, viewed on tables, should be mindful that their work is subject to very close scrutiny, more so than in a projected image only Salon. Attention to sharpness is therefore critical, if the work is to grab the judge's eye.

The creative section was also of a generally high standard. Nonetheless, the ongoing challenge of this section is to come up with new creative ideas, and the development of a personal style. Many works were let down by relying on 'recycled' creative ideas that judges have seen time and again. Moreover, when a creative work includes multiple elements which are not part of a coherent narrative, then the picture just remains a collection of elements. In addition, the inclusion of a female nude without such a narrative does little to trigger a positive response from a judge.

SALON JURY'S (CONTINUED)

Alex Syndikas (Colour, Creative & People) It was a great pleasure to be involved in judging in this year's VIGEX International Photographic Salon.

Colour is always an exciting medium to explore. It has the ability to transform surroundings, to excite a variety of reactions, as well as uplift and inspire mankind. In the 'Colour' category, entrants explored an infinite variety of interpretations of what colour meant to them. Digital manipulation was paramount, making great use of design, colour composition, lighting as well as capturing a unique vision of the natural and surreal world around them.

Creative has been another fulfilling section to judge. One always sees originality of thought, expression and imagination. In an era of Digital Imaging, the results are exponentially profound.

In the People category, I am always intrigued to see how entries attempt to capture the soul of the sitter(s) during a brief moment of their existences. This section truly focused on multicultural experiences, exploring different age groups, locations, dramatic lighting skills, the use of colour as well as a variety of digital interpretations with the medium.

Congratulations must go to all entrants and especially to those that have gained awards and honorable mentions.

Jeremy Bannister I was pleased to be asked to be one of the judges at this year's VIGEX competition as I don't often get to spend much time critiquing other photographers' work. As a photographer working in the media means that I'm normally so busy with my own work that I rarely get the time to enjoy seeing others' works.

I judged Monochrome, People and Photojournalism – all subjects very dear to my heart. Generally, the standard was very high and it was again a pleasure to see the creative exploits of other photographers from around the world

In the People section there seemed to be a plethora of fairly straightforward portraits of people from different ethnic cultures which unfortunately become a bit homogenised and all appear to be very similar. I would encourage all entrants to resist the temptation to enter straight, overly posed portraits as they can often appear too staged and a bit old fashioned. It's a matter of watching and waiting for the subject to show their real selves. Every day I encounter people who defiantly proclaim that they never look good in photographs. And every day I enjoy proving them

Just because you're in an "exotic" locale doesn't mean that you'll win a prize by photographing an inhabitant staring down the lens. To truly capture the essence of a good portrait you have to capture emotions or a

The really outstanding portraits had that essence which made you immediately drawn to them. Scanning the tables quickly always reveals at least one or two prints that stand out from the rest, and invariably they are the ones which capture that certain moment or expression.


I will always score these prints highly even if the technical quality of the print isn't perfect.

With Photojournalism, when shooting hard news you must act on instinct to make sure the moment is captured. There is no second chance in these circumstances – the impact of the moment is paramount. You can't set up the same scenario and try to re-capture the incident. The same should always apply especially in the photojournalism category.

I would also plead with people to resist using direct flash unless it's for fill in extreme back-lighting. There is nothing more unpleasant than flat, harsh light on subjects as well as the accompanying shadow caused by the direct flash. Investing in a cable or wireless transmitter completely eliminates the ugliness of direct flash.

Again I was pleased to see that my fellow judges concurred with my decisions on the award winning prints as it just reinforces the fact that a really good photograph will always catch the eye and be appreciated by everyone. Thanks to the huge amount of work by the organisers which ensured that the competition went off flawlessly.
